

Generally considered the most desirable of all reclaimed Heart Pine floors, clear vertical grain (quartersawn) Heart Pine was a longtime flooring of choice throughout the United States. Sadly, the old growth Longleaf Pine forests that produce these intensely clear and richly colored boards have been harvested out of existence.

These reclaimed boards have very few, if any, pin knots (under 1/2") or small nail holes, and no checking. This antique heartwood flooring boasts legendary old growth density, with a growth ring concentration of eight to the inch and greater.

Standard Dimensions

2-1/2" - 5" wide planks

2' to 12' lengths

3/4" thick

Tongue-and-groove and end-matched.



Grain

Straight, with occasional typical old-growth irregularity. 95%-100% heartwood content.

Color

Heartwood ranges from delicate yellows through oranges and into red and reddish-brown. Sapwood, if present, is a pleasant yellowish-white.

Character

Very few, if any, pin knots or small nail holes.

Hardness & Stability

A moderately hard and very stable wood. 1225lb_f ^{anecdotal} on the Janka hardness scale. ~2.56 pounds per square foot.
