Reclaimed Maple




Often reclaimed from agrarian applications, reclaimed maple connects its owner with the rich tradition of maple products that have sustained segments of the North American rural economy for generations. Closely associated with iconic American products such as maple syrup, bowling pins, and regional instruments, maple wood's cultural relevance is keenly matched by beauty in pattern, color, and form.

Reclaimed maple is an extremely hard floor featuring knots, nail holes, surface checking, and prominent worm wood.

Standard Dimensions

2.5" - 8.5" wide planks (wider w/special order) 2' to 12' lengths 3/4" thick, tongue-and-groove



Grain

Straight, with typical old-growth irregularities. Mixed flat and quartersawn.

Color

Ranges from an ivory white to tawny brown. Heartwood, if present, is of a darker and sometimes reddish color.

Character

Wormwood, knots, checking, and occassional nail holes with accompanying mineral stains are present and desirable.

Hardness & Stability

An extremely hard and relatively stable wood. 1,450lb $_{\rm f}$ on the Janka hardness scale. ~2.75 pounds per square foot.



Certifications

Qualifies for LEED MRc3, Materials Reuse credit. May qualify for LEED MRc5, Regional Materials credit.
