Salvaged from historic industrial and agricultural buildings, reclaimed spruce flooring is an elegant mixture of Red, Black, Norway, and White Spruce boards sawn from antique beams.

Featuring long, smooth, creamy lines and small to medium-sized knots, the floor lends a rustic air to traditional and formal straight grain. Darker knots and ocassional checking and nail holes make this floor a clean, refined alternative to the monotony of a floor sawn from new spruce or pine lumber.

Standard Dimensions

4" - 10" wide planks (wider upon special order) 4' to 14' lengths 3/4" thick, square-edged

Grain

Straight, with typical old-growth irregularities. Mixed flat and quartersawn.

Color

Color is creamy white, with hints of yellow and/or red. Knots are medium to dark brown.

Character

Old-growth knots, some checking, nail holes, and some mineral staining are present and desirable.

Hardness & Stability

A soft and stable wood. ~467lb $_{\rm f}$ on the Janka hardness scale. ~1.67 pounds per square foot.
